
Seneca Highlands IU9 2023 Paraprofessional Book Study The Whole-Brain Child by Siegel & Bryson



In this pioneering, practical book, the authors present a revolutionary approach to child rearing with twelve key strategies that foster healthy brain development, leading to calmer, happier children. Who is the book study for? Paraprofessionals

How does it work? Participants will borrow or purchase the book: *The Whole-Brain Child* (ISBN-10: 9780553386691) from Amazon (https://amzn.to/3MzM7aF) or another source, read the assigned chapters, complete short assignments, and participate in weekly discussions held virtually via Zoom.

When is it? July 12, 19, 26, and August 2. When registering, select the time you want to attend. Your choices are 9:00-10:00 am or 10:30-11:30 am or 1:30-2:30 pm or 6:00-7:00 pm. Registration will be limited to 10 people for each time slot.

What do you need to participate? You must have access to a computer (camera, speakers, and internet), an email address that you'll check each week starting the week before the book study, and a working knowledge of Zoom. How many training hours will you receive? Participants who complete <u>all</u> the book study requirements will be issued 11 training hours. Check with your supervisor to make sure the hours count toward your 20 annual training requirements.
